REVERENCE AT COMMUNION

The Church has asked all Catholics to practice utmost reverence at the time of receiving Holy Communion by making a sign of reverence upon approaching the priest or minister: a simple bow of the head is sufficient.

The normative posture for receiving is standing -- kneeling draws unnecessary attention to oneself and disrupts the flow of the procession. Besides, receiving communal one. If you are receiving Communion in your hand, place your hands in the form of a "throne," one hand flat over the other. When "The Body of Christ" is said, we answer "Amen": a way of saying, "Yes, I believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist" -- so let your "Amen" to Jesus coming to you be heard!
