WHY DO WE PRAY THE WAY OF THE CROSS EVERY FRIDAY OF LENT?

Walking the Way of the Cross is a wonderful Lenten devotion. Lent is a penitential season of preparation for Easter, the Stations of the Cross, which follow the path of Christ from Pontius Pilate's praetorium to Christ's tomb have been a popular devotion in the history of the Church. Please plan on attending our Way of the Cross Stations) beginning the First Week of Lent, Fri, Mar 14, at 6:00 pm. Church is open at 5:30 pm with Eucharistic Adoration prior to the Stations. Attending Weekday Mass is also a great habit to form for Lent and beyond. Weekday Masses in Lent Tuesday to Friday 9:00 am.

Lent for all Catholics is a time of renewal. It is a time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

WHY DO WE USE ASHES ON ASH WEDNESDAY?

The ashes symbolize both death and repentance. During this period, Christians show repentance and mourning for their sins, because they believe Christ died for them. When the priest or lay minister applies the cross of ashes, she/he says to the worshiper: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." They may also may say "Repent and believe in the Gospel." It is not required that a worshiper wear the ashes for the rest of the day, although many Christians choose to do so. However, dining out or doing non-essential shopping are inappropriate on Ash Wednesday.

PARISH FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

The four (4) Pillars of Parish Stewardship are: **Hospitality, Prayer, Formation, and Service**.

Hospitality: is the hallmark of the Christian.Prayer: is necessary for the life of a disciple.Formation: sets our foundation for our life faith and our stewardship.

Service: is what we do here. Serving one another in the Body of Christ.
